



















Introduction to the National Office for Tunisian Handicrafts

O.N.A.T

The National Office for Tunisian Handicrafts was established on October 14, 1959. It is supervised by the Toursim and Handicrafts Ministry.

Its mission consists in preserving the national cultural heritage and in rescuing numerous crafts from fading out and disappearing. Such crafts should become artistic crafts matching the spirit of this era and consumer's tastes.

The ONAT has been restructured in 1990. This laid the ground for the sector's reform. It renounced production and marketing missions and directed all its attention and activity to shape up the sector, develop traditional product in both inside and outside markets, promote investment, control the quality of the produce and encourage research and design.

Handicrafts in Tunisia

The history of Tunisia is rich with the different civilizations it has known and men who have perpetuated its brilliance through time. The craft heritage of Tunisia bears today the imprint of each of them, whether Numidian, Carthaginian, Roman or Arab Muslims. Currently, the craft sector serves some dynamism in the economy. Activities and professional craft practices are spread all over the country and draw deep in the rich history of the oldest traditions of our ancestors.

Enjoying special care by public authorities, craft occupies 11% of the entire workforce. 85% of Tunisian craftspeople are women. The craft generates about 300 thousand jobs and represents to this day, 4% of GDP.

It is a fact; job creation in the handicraft sector is characterized by a reduced cost of spin-off activities across the territory. Today, contemporary Tunisian handicrafts are a mirror image of the country: modern, with a footprint of tradition.

Through a process which consists in rehabilitating traditional crafts, master craftsmen: potters and ceramists, weavers, wool silk carpet artisans, jewelers, carpenters and stonemasons... perpetuate these traditions giving rise to great creations, certainly inherited, but updated and redesigned to suit contemporary trends.

Many handicraft products made in the pure tradition, and in the secret of the artisanal workshops, are the result of an innovative power, built up over the years under the guidance of the National Office of Tunisian Crafts.

Artisan Resources

Fifteen creators of Tunisian luxury craft whose expertise combines tradition and modernity, offer their Tunisian inspiration. Already identified by individuals or professional buyers they will meet this year at the International Exhibition Ambiente 2018.

A demanding and consistent selection

Real bridges between ancestral heritage and abundant creativity of designers and artisans eager to revive shapes, graphics and old techniques. The selection consists of fashion accessories such as natural weaved baskets, and also decoration objects from carpets, textile in linens, fouta. Lighting, dinnerware and kitchen accessories made from ceramic, copper and olive wood complete the collections.

All these quality new collections are made of materials from traditional local crafts (flax, wool bunting, silk, natural bers) and revisited in the light of urban and international trends.

A responsible concept

The trend is to safe values, objects which convey a story and whose ethical spirit brings its letters of nobility in the act of purchase. "The Craftsmen of Tunisia" seek to be the actors of a more friendly trade of man and his environment. Selected craftsmen benefit from the support of the National Office of Tunisian Crafts (ONAT) to promote exports of handicraft products in the European market.



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International Trade Centre

The International Trade Centre (ITC) is the joint agency of the United Nations and the World Trade Organization. ITC is fully dedicated to supporting the internationalization of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). The agency enables SMEs in developing and transition economies to become more competitive and connect to international markets for trade and investment, thus raising incomes and creating job opportunities, especially for women, young people, and poor communities.

This work has been prepared under a technical assistance programme, funded by the Government of Japan, supporting export-driven economic growth in the handicrafts sector in North Africa.


It is precisely our "hobby": the Fouta, comes in Tunisia manifold for use - as a scarf, shawl or blanket in all conceivable situations. Items such as shepherdesses their traditional Berber costumes often with a Fouta.

Yet the Fouta is also worn on special occasions - embroidered with real gold and silver threads. Color and material of the Fouta and the way they can, in addition, provide information on the respective region in Tunisia. This shows how deep the Fouta is interwoven as fabric and garment with the life of Tunisians.

Our scarves, shawls and blankets are unique pieces that are reproduced in limited quantities. All of our products are of the highest quality and are made of selected, fine and pure cotton, which is partly replaced by pure silk in our shawls.

Traditionally handcrafted in elaborate and sustainable process, we protect the environment and contribute to the preservation of arts and crafts and the associated jobs.

The people who stand behind our products, live in rural areas of Tunisia. For the design of our products we work with together with weavers who are masters of their craft and maintain the traditional craft of weaving for generations.



Berbère Carpet Hall 8.0 - B70/B71

The Tunisian brand Berbère Carpet offers a wide range of Kilims and Margoums in two styles: the traditional and the modern... 100% handmade sheep wool.

In order to be always up-to-date, the brand is required to follow trends, colors used by designers, geometric patterns in vogue, or the style of the most influential furniture of the moment such as Scandinavian style, industrial style or even Navajo style.

Note that the brand uses a lot of colors and especially those inspired by nature such as lemon yellow, fresh mint or sky blue ... Weaving at Berbere carpet is a craft of art and culture!

The shape of the Berbere Carpet logo is a Berber letter created by the painter Ben Marzouk. By choosing the logo in English, the brand aims for the international.



Cluster Nabeul Hall 8.0 B70/B71

The Nabeul Cluster focuses on ceramics, more generally on tableware and home goods. The portfolio presented here includes dishes, pots and tea services, all produced from white and red clay for decorative and design purposes.

The range also covers a variety of kitchen utensils made with heat resistant clay, table decorations such as candlesticks, napkin holders, lamps and vases, as well as items made of olive wood and hand-blown glass.

Of the 24 clusters identified throughout the country, Nabeul was selected because of its strong potential for the region's economic development. Located on the east coast of Tunisia, Nabeul has become one of the major places of ceramic production and thus a leading tourist destination.













Centre 3T Hall 8.0 B70/B71

The Technical center of creation "Centre 3t" - specializes in carpet conception and weaving. The team encourages inovating designs whilst maintaining the original details and know-how of the national patrimony.

Hand weaving, manual spinning and traditional dying of floor carpets, tapestries and wool blankets are achieved by expert artisans to enhance the quality and diverseness of raw materials.







Etandart Hall 8.0 B70/B71

Etandart was created in 1992 by Mina Ben Miled, a Tunisian architect whose passion is handicraft design.

She explores multiple traditional craftsmanship methods, which inspire her to produce authentic but modern artefacts. The techniques she uses are purely traditional, but the dimensions, patterns and colors are constantly updated and adapted to modern taste and needs, in order to be integrated in a contemporary universe.

The company offers complete collections of wool and cotton Mergoums (Tunisian flat woven rugs), wool throws, wool and natural fiber Kilims, rush floor mats and baskets, etc. All products are hand made in genuine materials and freely inspired from classical traditional models.

Our main textile production of bedcovers, scarves and especially Foutas (hammam towels) are woven on antique semi-mechanical looms, unlike those currently available on the market, which are woven on industrial looms. They come in multiple sizes, have very absorbent textures and are ideal for either the bathroom, the gym or the beach.

The whole collection is produced in various regions of the country, from North to South, to promote and sustain the unique craftsmanship of each region. These handicraft traditions are part of the culture, soul and history of Tunisia. Creating new models and prospecting new markets, our aim is to preserve this heritage.









La Carthagenoise

Clay pottery is an activity going back to millennia.

Whenever you visit the Tunisian Sahel, you are welcome to Walid Nacef in moknine where you can see different clay-made in different sizes and shapes capturing a whole past with rich civilizations: Phoenicians, Punics, Romans, Arabs...

Every item you buy is the result of long hours of skilled hand labour

Please visit us and you will see how reasonable our prices are and how beautiful our pottery is made from three basic materials: Clay, water and salt.

Placed in the basin, it is then mixed with a machine "Molaize" - when the mixture becomes a paste the pottery is made by hand. After 30 days, the pottery is ready to go in the oven to be burned with olive wood and olive waste.

After completing eight days in the oven, the pottery is ready to go out and offered for sale.

The artisanal touch of our products gives them a unique value inspired by Tunisian rich heritage.










